Source and Content

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Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

Excludes stocks in transit after July 1, 1968.

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of January 1969, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 61,942,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 34,670,000 lb. while dairy factories held 27,272,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 5.6 million pounds. The five-year average 1964-68 of January 1 stocks is 84,421,000 lb. The December 1968 "out-of-storage" movement was 9.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 13.2 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 82,805,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was lower than last year by 5.8 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 5.3 million pounds for December 1968.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 35,822,000 lb. which was an increase of 3.8 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December 1968 was 6.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 210,056,000 lb., an increase of 72.5 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 1.0 million pounds from last month.

Eggs

The January 1, 1969 report shows 1,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 76,000 cases of fresh eggs. Frozen eggs totalled 5,361,000 lb. being 2.3 million pounds lower than the 1968 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for December 1968 was 113 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 397 thousand pounds during December 1968.

Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at January 1, 1969 was lower than last year by 2.5 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 33.5 million pounds is shown for the month of December 1968. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 15,001,000 lb., Fowl, 3,308,000 lb., Turkey, 33,793,000 lb., Duck, 370,000 lb. and Goose, 209,000 lb.
