Source and Content

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Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

Excludes stocks in transit after July 1, 1968.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### February 1, 1969

#### Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of February 1969, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 51,244,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 26,490,000 lb. while dairy factories held 24,754,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 8.3 million pounds. The five-year average 1964-68 of February 1 stocks is 72,502,000 lb. The January 1969 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 13.4 million pounds last year.

#### Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 79,674,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was lower than last year by 728 thousand pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.2 million pounds for January 1969.

#### Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 30,571,000 lb. which was an increase of 6.9 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for January 1969 was 5.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 215,598,000 lb., an increase of 82.4 million pounds over last year and an increase of 5.0 million pounds over last month.

#### Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at February 1, 1969 totalled 4,143,000 lb. being 3.3 million pounds lower than the 1968 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for January 1969 was 816 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 189 thousand pounds during January 1968.

#### Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at February 1, 1969 was higher than last year by 803 thousand pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 4.3 million pounds is shown for the month of January 1969. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 18,102,000 lb., Fowl, 3,152,000 lb., Turkey, 35,492,000 lb., Duck, 292,000 lb. and Goose, 42,000 lb.
