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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

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Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

Excludes stocks in transit after July 1, 1968.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

April 1, 1969

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of April 1969, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 32,354,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 15,015,000 lb. while dairy factories held 17,339,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 13.9 million pounds. The five-year average 1964-68 of April 1 stocks is 47,061,000 lb. The March 1969 "out-of-storage" movement was 8.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 9.2 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 60,029,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was lower than last year by 11.1 million pounds and showed an "out of storage" movement of 16.5 million pounds for March 1969.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 15,955,000 lb. which was an increase of 1.7 million pounds over last year. The "outof-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1969 was 4.6 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 198,817,000 lb. an increase of 68.0 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 5.8 million pounds from last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at April 1, 1969 totalled 3,779,000 lb. being 3.3 million pounds lower than the 1968 figures. The "out-of storage" movement for March 1969 was 421 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 66 thousand pounds during March 1968.

Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at April 1, 1969 was higher than last year by 3.2 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 7.3 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1969. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 17,544,000 lb., Fowl, 3,341,000 lb., Turkey, 30,953,000 lb., Duck, 176,000 lb. and Goose, 36,000 lb.

Turkey meat intended for further processing

Stocks of turkey meat for the second quarter beginning April 1, amounted to 2,237,000 pounds. These include all whole birds that are intended for processing into cut-up turkey parts, rolls and roasts, or canning.
