MAY 1969

Source and Content

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Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.


Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

May 1, 1969

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of May 1969, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 34,506,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 18,466,000 lb. while dairy factories held 16,040,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 16.7 million pounds. The five-year average 1964-68 of May 1 stocks is 46,677,000 lb. The April 1969 "in-to-storage" movement was 2.4 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 664 thousand pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 64,843,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was lower than last year by 5.0 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 4.4 million pounds for April 1969.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 13,576,000 lb. which was a decrease of 4.4 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April 1969 was 2.4 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 199,810,000 lb. an increase of 59.1 million pounds over last year and an increase of 346 thousand pounds over last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at May 1, 1969 totalled 3,061,000 lb. being 3.6 million pounds lower than the 1968 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for April 1969 was 523 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 432 thousand pounds during April 1968.

Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at May 1, 1969 was higher than last year by 6.4 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 5.1 million pounds is shown for the month of April 1969. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 18,176,000 lb., Fowl, 3,292,000 lb., Turkey, 25,982,000 lb., Duck, 154,000 lb. and Goose, 32,000 lb.
