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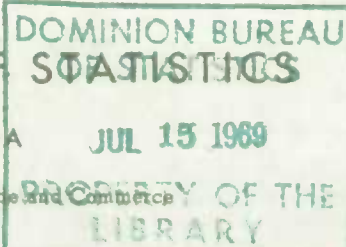
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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

July 1969

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

July 1, 1969

### Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of July 1969, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 64,215,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 38,066,000 lb. while dairy factories held 26,149,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 20.9 million pounds. The five-year average 1964-68 of July 1 stocks is 70,514,000 lb. The June 1969 "in-to-storage" movement was 19.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 18.8 million pounds last year.

### Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 78,866,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was lower than last year by 5.9 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 12.2 million pounds for June 1969.

### Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 39,871,000 lb. which was an increase of 2.3 million pounds over last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for June 1969 was 13.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 196,391,000 lb. an increase of 8.8 million pounds over last year and an increase of 8.0 million pounds over last month.

### Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at July 1, 1969 totalled 4,318,000 lb. being 3.9 million pounds lower than the 1968 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for June 1969 was 836 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 926 thousand pounds during June 1968.

### Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at July 1, 1969 was higher than last year by 94 thousand pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.6 million pounds is shown for the month of June 1969. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 13,903,000 lb., Fowl, 3,008,000 lb., Turkey, 19,489,000 lb., Duck, 658,000 lb. and Goose, 27,000 lb.

### Turkey meat intended for further processing

Stocks of turkey meat for the third quarter beginning July 1, amounted to 493,000 pounds. These include all whole birds that are intended for processing into cut-up turkey parts, rolls and roasts, or canning.
