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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FROZEN POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1970

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, growers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments; while stocks of poultry products are obtained with the co-operation of the Canada Department of Agriculture.

Beginning September I, 1970, the data in this publication has reference to frozen poultry products only. Previously, fresh and frozen poultry products were reported and published in total only. Therefore, current stocks of poultry products are no longer comparable to those reported prior to September 1, 1970.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FROZEN POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1970

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of October 1970, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 118,447,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 14.4 million pounds. The five-year average 1965-1969 of October 1 stocks is 91,463,000 lb. The September 1970 "in-to-storage" movement was 2.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.9 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 73,315,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was lower than last year by 22.9 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 1.6 million pounds for September 1970.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 40,061,000 lb. which was a decrease of 14.2 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1970 was 1.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 163,291,000 lb. a decrease of 52.3 million pounds from last year and an increase of 7.4 million pounds over last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at October 1, 1970 totalled 8,230,000 lb. being 2.8 million pounds higher than the 1969 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for September 1970 was 658 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 133 thousand pounds during September 1969.

Frozen poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated frozen poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1970 was higher than last year by 3.1 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 17.7 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1970. By kind, the frozen stocks were: Chicken, 22,702,000 lb., Fowl, 6,108,000 lb., Turkey, 45,631,000 lb., Duck, 1,030,000 lb. and Goose, 158,000 lb.. Changes in stocks are subject to the incomparability of the data, reference paragraph 4, Page 1.
