## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

April 1970 Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

## April 1, 1970

## Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of April 1970, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 66,023,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 42,242,000 lb. while dairy factories held 23,781,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 33.6 million pounds. The five-year average 1965-1969 of April 1 stocks is 33,531,000 lb. The March 1970 "out-of-storage" movement was 7.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 8.3 million pounds last year.

#### Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 70,827,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.2 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 5.4 million pounds for March 1970.

## Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 23,480,000 lb. which was an increase of 7.5 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1970 was 4.1 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 96,933,000 lb. a decrease of 103.8 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 20.7 million pounds from last month.

#### Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at April 1, 1970 totalled 3,276,000 lb. being 195 thousand pounds lower than the 1969 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for March 1970 was 32 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 657 thousand pounds during March 1969.

#### Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at April 1, 1970 was lower than last year by 6.7 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 4.8 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1970. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 21,409,000 lb., Fowl, 3,057,000 lb., Turkey, 20,626,000 lb., Duck, 466,000 lb. and Goose, 227,000 lb.
