STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

May 1970

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Hay 1, 1970

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of Hay 1970, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 68,581,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 43,774,000 lb. while dairy factories held 24,807,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 33.4 million pounds. The five-year average 1965-1969 of May 1 stocks is 34,002,000 lb. The April 1970 "in-to-storage" movement was 2.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 2.8 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 61,937,000 lb. Canadian. The summary total was lower than last year by 3.6 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 9.0 million pounds for April 1970.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 23,366,000 lb. which was an increase of 9.8 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April 1970 was 114 thousand pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 82,830,000 lb. a decrease of 119.3 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 14.7 million pounds from last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at Hay 1, 1970 totalled 3,726,000 lb. being 734 thousand pounds higher than the 1969 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for April 1970 was 445 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 479 thousand pounds during April 1969.

Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at Hay 1, 1970 was lower than last year by 2.0 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 713 thousand pounds is shown for the month of April 1970. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 21,529,000 lb., Fowl, 2,777,000 lb., Turkey, 20,141,000 lb., Duck, 568,000 lb. and Goose, 196,000 lb.
