

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FROZEN POULTRY PRODUCTS

OCTOBER 1, 1972

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, growers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments; while stocks of poultry products are obtained with the co-operation of the Canada Department of Agriculture.

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of October 1972, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 56,116,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 16.9 million pounds. The five-year average 1967-1971 of October 1 stocks is 90,879,000 lb. The September 1972 "out-of-storage" movement was 391 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.1 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 83,565,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 14.8 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 630 thousand pounds for September 1972.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 44,569,000 lb. which was an increase of 7.0 million pounds over last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1972 was 518 thousand pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 172,478,000 lb. an increase of 102.8 million pounds over last year and an increase of 22.6 million pounds over last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at October 1972 totalled 10,476,000 lb. being 1.7 million pounds lower than the 1971 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September 1972 was 434 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 700 thousand pounds during September 1971.

Frozen poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated frozen poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1972 was lower than last year by 18.3 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 14.6 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1972. By kind, the frozen stocks were: Chicken, 16,170,000 lb., Fowl, 4,229,000 lb., Turkey, 47,697,000 lb., Duck, 1,253,000 lb. and Goose, 62,000 lb.


