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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FROZEN POULTRY PRODUCTS

May 1, 1972

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, growers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments; while stocks of poultry products are obtained with the co-operation of the Canada Department of Agriculture.

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of May 1972, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 21,676,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 27.6 million pounds. The five-year average 1967-1971 of May 1 stocks is 39,979,000 lb. The April 1972 "out-of-storage" movement was 626 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.7 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 60,328,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 13.6 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.5 million pounds for April 1972.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 12,742,000 lb. which was a decrease of 2.4 million pounds from last year. The "out-of storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April 1972 was 7.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 39,525,000 lb. an increase of 1.3 million pounds over last year and an increase of 7.1 million pounds over last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at May 1, 1972 totalled 12,769,000 lb. being 3.3 million pounds higher than the 1971 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for April 1972 was 892 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 1.3 million pounds during April 1971.

Frozen poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated frozen poultry meat stocks at May 1, 1972 was lower than last year by 16.6 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 35 thousand pounds is shown for the month of April 1972. By kind, the frozen stocks were: Chicken, 17,358,000 lb., Fowl, 4,720,000 lb., Turkey, 20,284,000 lb., Duck, 747,000 lb. and Goose, 73,000 lb.




