

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FROZEN POULTRY PRODUCTS

AUGUST 1, 1972

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, growers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments; while stocks of poultry products are obtained with the co-operation of the Canada Department of Agriculture.

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of August 1972, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 50,519,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 20.0 million pounds. The five-year average 1967-1971 of August 1 stocks is 75,933,000 lb. The July 1972 "in-to-storage" movement was 9.7 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.5 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 77,369,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 17.2 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 7.3 million pounds for July 1972.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 41,164,000 lb. which was an increase of 140 thousand pounds over last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for July 1972 was 5.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 135,114,000 lb. an increase of 54.2 million pounds over last year and an increase of 35.0 million pounds over last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at August 1, 1972 totalled 10,914,000 lb. being 107 thousand pounds lower than the 1971 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for July 1972 was 285 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 373 thousand pounds during July 1971.

Frozen poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated frozen poultry meat stocks at August 1, 1972 was lower than last year by 17.6 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 6.6 million pounds is shown for the month of July 1972. By kind, the frozen stocks were: Chicken, 16,550,000 lb., Fowl, 4,854,000 lb., Turkey, 22,202,000 lb., Duck, 1,179,000 lb. and Goose, 47,000 lb.


