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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FROZEN POULTRY PRODUCTS

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JANUARY 1, 1973

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, growers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments; while stocks of poultry products are obtained with the co-operation of the Canada Department of Agriculture.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FROZEN POULTRY PRODUCTS

JANUARY 1, 1973

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of January 1973, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 29,686,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 21.7 million pounds. The five-year average 1968-1972 of January 1 stocks is 70,027,000 lb. The December 1972 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 6.7 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 70,381,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 6.9 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.2 million pounds for December 1972.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 29,543,000 lb. which was a decrease of 5.0 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December 1972 was 2.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 163,033,000 lb. an increase of 125.4 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 552 thousand pounds from last month.

Frozen eggs

Stocks of frozen eggs at January 1 1973 totalled 8,118,000 lb. being 4.0 million pounds lower than the 1972 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for December 1972 was 576 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 71 thousand pounds during December 1971.

Frozen poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated frozen poultry meat stocks at January 1, 1973 was lower than last year by 1.3 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 33.6 million pounds is shown for the month of December 1972. By kind, the frozen stocks were: Chicken, 26,020,000 lb., Fowl, 4,545,000 lb., Turkey, 23,568,000 lb., Duck, 389,000 lb. and Goose, 185,000 lb.

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
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
