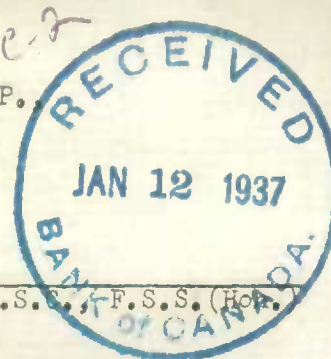

COLD STORAGE STOCKS OF APPLES, JANUARY 1, 1937.

Apples held in cold storage establishments and in fruit storages at January 1, 1937, amounted to 97,062 barrels, 480,046 boxes, 195,269 hampers, 24,505 bushels and 12,216 crates and baskets. Compared with January 1, 1936 these figures show increases in all classes except boxes which shows a decrease of approximately 224 thousand. The remaining figures show increases of approximately 29 thousand barrels, 71 thousand hampers and 9 thousand crates and baskets. Converting barrels to boxes, it shows a net increase of approximately 86 thousand boxes. This advance in apple holdings is partly accounted for by the addition of 16 new firms added to the list since January 1, 1936. Between December 1, 1936 and January 1, 1937, there were decreases of approximately 20 thousand barrels, 808 thousand boxes and 14 thousand crates and baskets. Hampers show an increase of approximately 70 thousand from last month. 19 firms handling apples are listed as outstanding.

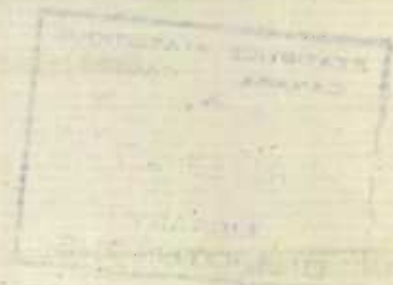
