STOCKS OF CANADIAN TREE FRUITS, SMALL FRUITS AND VEGETABLES, DECEMBER 1, 1937.

Apples held in Cold and Common Storage at December 1, 1937 amounted to 128,289 barrels, 1,583,980 boxes, and 400,032 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures show a decrease of approximately 394 thousand bushels from November 1, 1937, with 145 firms reporting as against 148 last month. Compared with December 1, 1936, the combined figures show an increase of approximately 625 thousand bushels, with 145 firms reporting as against 146 at this time last year.

Stocks of Pears in Cold and Common Storage at December 1, 1937 amounted to 21,744 bushels as against 38,983 at November 1, 1937 and 10,552 at December 1, 1936.

Stocks of small fruit, fresh and frozen, may be partially summarized as follows, the figures at the first of last month appearing in brackets: Raspberries 10,224 crates (11,269); 21,644 pints (27,259); 953 barrels (1,564); 266,840 pounds (278,030). Strawberries: 5,909 crates(6,734);3,451 barrels(4,361); 396 pails (1,938); 642,448 pounds (761,065). Cherries: 347 barrels (444); 1,984 pails (3,387); 263,972 pounds (236,284); Blueberries: 7,529 crates (2,252); 33,636 quarts (61,352); 630,201 pounds (753,744).

Vegetables held in Cold and Common Storage as at December 1, 1937 are reported by provinces, with comparative data for November 1, 1937. The holdings of potatoes amounted to 56,984 cwt. at December 1, 1937, compared with 31,546 cwt. a month ago, representing an increase of 25,438 cwt. Onion stocks reached a total of 43,249 cwt. at December 1, 1937, in comparison with 35,827 cwt. at the first of the previous month, showing an increase of 7,422 cwt. Celery amounted to 157,783 crates at December 1, 1937, as compared with 183,169 crates at November 1, 1937, showing a decrease of 25,386 crates.
