STOCKS OF APPLES, PEARS, SMALL FRUITS AND VEGETABLES, MARCH 1, 1937.

Apples held in cold storage establishments and in sales warehouses at March 1, 1937 amounted to 48,237 barrels, 222,274 boxes, 81,863 hampers, 21,237 bushels and 10,278 crates. Compared with the holdings at March 1, 1936, these figures show decreases of approximately 154 thousand boxes and 21 thousand hampers, and increases of approximately 10 thousand barrels and 9 thousand crates. Compared with February 1, 1937 the data reveal decreases of approximately 20 thousand barrels, 153 thousand boxes, 67 thousand hampers and 6 thousand crates, and an increase of 2 thousand bushels. Converting barrels to boxes the combined figures show decreases of approximately 123 thousand boxes from March 1, 1936 and 211 thousand boxes from the same date last month. Out of a total of 182 apple reporting firms, 28 failed to report at March 1. It is believed, however, that many of these had nothing in storage.

Stocks of frozen fruit held under refrigeration at March 1, 1937 are shown in Table III, the contents of which may be partially summarized as follows, the figures at the first of last month appearing in brackets: Raspberries: 1,908 $\frac{1}{2}$ crates (1,289); 26,725 pints (30,339); 629 $\frac{1}{2}$ barrels (956) and 142,831 pounds (220,070). Strawberries: 4,926 crates (5,332); 34,140 quarts (15,116); 3,798 pints (3,399); 318 barrels (855); 484,546 pounds (560,639). Blueberries: 259 crates (523); 27,995 quarts (31,736) and 59,287 pounds (75,691).


Fruit Pulp and SO₂ products held in refrigerated and ordinary rooms combined at March 1, 1937 amounted to 655 barrels of raspberries and 2,282 barrels of strawberries, compared with 696 barrels and 2,473 barrels at the first of the previous month.

Vegetables held in cold storages and sales warehouses (stocks in refrigerated and ordinary rooms combined) as at March 1, 1937 are reported in Table V by provinces, with comparative data for February 1, 1937. The holdings of Potatoes amounted to 81,133 hundredweights at March 1, 1937 compared with 86,889 hundredweights a month ago, representing a decrease of 5,756 hundredweights or 6.6 per cent. Onion stocks reached a total of 32,166 hundredweights on March 1, 1937 in comparison with 32,068 hundredweights at the first of the previous month, an increase of 98 hundredweights. Celery holdings amounted to 8,375 crates on March 1, 1937 as against 26,915 on February 1, 1937 which represents a decrease of 18,540 crates or 68.9 per cent.


