STO ES OF CANADIAN TREE FRUITS, SMALL FRUITS AND VEGETABLES, JANU RY 1, 1938.

Apples held in Cold and Common Storage, and for the first time including storage by commercial growers, are compiled by provinces and by principal cities. At January 1, 1938 in Canada there were 601,342 barrels, 1,594,634 boxes, and 318,182 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels, the combined figures are 3,716,842 bushels.

Stocks of small frozen fruits are shown as: straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and pulp. Small fruits in sulphur dioxide are now shown separately.

Vegetables held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by commercial growers, are reported by provinces. At January 1, 1938, the holdings of potatoes, in Canada, amounted to, 150,454 tons, onion stocks reached a total of 4,055 tons, and celery amounted to 59,907 crates.
