### STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT, AND VEGETABLES, DECEMBER 1, 1938.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by commercial growers, are compiled by provinces and by principal cities. At December 1, 1938 in Canada there were 957,060 barrels, 2,156,993 boxes and 588,878 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures are 5,617,051 bushels, compared with 8,209,759 bushels at November 1, 1938, a decrease of 2.6 million bushels.

Canadian pears reached a total of 27,360 bushels compared with 66,332 bushels at November 1, 1938, a decrease of 39 thousand bushels.

Stocks of frozen fruit are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and pulp. Fruit in sulphur dioxide is shown separately. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for all frozen and SO, fruit as reported, is 863 thousand lb.

Canadian-grown vegetables held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by commercial growers, are reported by provinces. At December 1, 1938, the holdings of potatoes amounted to 219,712 tons, compared with 264,262 tons at November 1, 1938, a decrease of 45 thousand tons. Onion stocks reached a total of 13,097 tons as compared with 14,350 at the first of last month, showing a decrease of 1 thousand tons.

Canadian celery amounted to 180,334 crates, compared with 242,925 at November 1, 1938, showing a decrease of 63 thousand crates.
