STOCKS OF CANADIAN TRE FRUITS, SWALL FRUITS AND VEGETADLES, FLRZUIRY 1, 1938.
Apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by commercial growers, are compiled by provinces and by principal cities. At February 1,1938 in Canada there were 348,195 barrels, $1,065,211$ boxes, and 222,811 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures are 2.332,607 bushels, compared with $3,716,842$ bushels at January 1,1938 , which represents a decrease of approximately 1.4 million bushels.

Stocks of small frozen fruits are shown as: straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and pulp. Small fruits in sulphur dioxide are now shown separately. The net Oit-of Btorage movement shown by these reports is, for: Frozen Raspberries 264,000 los and Frozen Strawberries $1,108,000 \mathrm{Ib}$.

Vegetables held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by commerciel growers, are reported by provinces. At February 1, 1938, the holdings of potatoes, in Canada, amounted to 128,922 tons, compared with 150,454 tons at January l, 1938, which represents a decrease of 21,532 tons. Onion stocks reached a total of 2,321 tons as compared with 4,055 at the first of last month, showing a decrease of 1,734 tons.
