STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT, AND VEGETABLES, AUGUST 1, 1938.
Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage at distributing points are compiled by provinces and by principal cities. At August 1, 1938 in Canada there were 5,921 boxes and 1,809 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures are 7,730 bushels, compared with 9,071 bushels at July 1, 1938, which is a decrease of 2,341 bushels.

Stocks of frozen fruit are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts Bruit to one part sugar, and pulp. Fruit in sulphur dioxide is shown separately. The net "Into-Storage" movement, shown for all frozen and $\mathrm{SO}_{2}$ fruit as reported, is 2,018,518 Ib .

Canadian-grown vegetables held in Cold and Common Storage at distributing points are reported by provinces. \&t August 1,1938 , the holdings of potatoes amounted to 1,246 tons, compered with 3,300 tons at July 1, 1938, which is a decrease of 1,054 tons. Onion stocks reached a total of 281 tons as compared with 10 at the first of last month, showing ai a increase of 271 tons.
