

#### STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT, AND VEGETABLES, SEPTEMBER 1, 1938.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage at distributing points are compiled by provinces and by principal cities. At September 1, 1938 in Canada there were 1,978 barrels, 13,519 boxes and 1,544 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures are 20,997 bushels, compared with 7,730 bushels at August 1, 1938, which is an increase of 13,267 bushels.

Canadian pears are again reported, totalling 37,033 bushels.

Stocks of frozen fruit are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and pulp. Fruit in sulphur dioxide is shown separately. The net "Into-Storage" movement for all frozen and SO2 fruit as reported, is 156,837 lb.


Canadian-grown vegetables held in Cold and Common Storage at distributing points are reported by provinces. At September 1, 1938, the holdings of potatoes amounted to 787 tons, compared with 1,246 tons at August 1, 1938, which is a decrease of 459 tons. Onion stocks reached a total of 347 tons as compared with 281 at the first of last month, showing an increase of 66 tons.

Canadian celery is again reported with 4,707 crates.
