STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, OCTOBER 1, 1939.

APPLES.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage at distributing centres were 15,570 barrels, 60,156 boxes and 79,060 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 185,926 bushels, compared with 1,786,355 bushels at October 1, 1938, and 19,318 bushels on September 1, 1939. The apparent "Into-Storage" movement was 166,608 bushels.

PEARS.

Stocks of Canadian pears at distributing centres were reported as 70,137 bushels as compared with 116,412 bushels a year ago.

FROZEN AND SO<sub>2</sub> FRUIT.

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 9,115,691 lb.

Fruit in SO<sub>2</sub> totalled 6,379,026 lb.

Frozen and SO<sub>2</sub> fruit combined were 15,494,717 lb. but several firms had not reported at time of going to press.

VEGETABLES.

Potato holdings, Canadian grown, amounted to 3,372 tons, as compared with 25,339 tons a year ago, and 963 tons on September 1, 1939.

Onion stocks, Canadian grown, were reported as 2,034 tons, as compared with 4,898 tons at the same date last year, and 499 tons on September 1, 1939.

Celery stocks, Canadian grown, were reported at distributing centres as 157,580 crates while a year ago the stocks were 94,549 crates. On September 1, 1939 there were 1,933 crates reported.
