STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, DECEMBER 1, 1939

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by Commercial growers, were 1,663,523 barrels, 2,250,186 boxes and 802,740 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 8,043,495 bushels, compared with 5,617,051 bushels at December 1, 1938, and 11,176,092 bushels on November 1, 1939. The apparent "Out-of-Storage" movement was 3,132,597 bushels.

PEARS. Stocks of Canadian pears, including storage by Commercial growers were reported as 18,487 bushels, as compared with 27,360 bushels a year ago. In addition there were 1,641 bushels Imported pears.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT. Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 6,878,767 lb. not including an estimate of 200,000 lb. for firms that failed to report in time.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 5,431,921 lb. These figures do not include an estimate of 600,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 12,310,688 lb., not including estimates shown above.

VEGETABLES. Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including storage by Commercial growers were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 389,629 tons, as compared with 219,712 tons a year ago, and 255,264 tons on November 1, 1939, but Commercial growers in the Province of Quebec were not included last year or last month.

Onion stocks were reported as 21,072 tons, as compared with 13,097 tons at the same date last year, and 22,502 tons on November 1, 1939.

Celery stocks were reported as 285,667 crates while a year ago the stocks were 180,334 crates. On November 1, 1939 there were 367,666 crates reported.
