## STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JUNE 1, 1939.

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by commercial growers were 867 barrels, 43,113 boxes and 1,465 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 47,179 bushels, compared with 57,419 bushels at June 1, 1938, and 213,252 bushels at May 1, 1939, but Ontario figures are not complete.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT. Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 3,354,787 lb. including 104,000 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report.

Fruit in SO<sub>2</sub> totalled 2,367,195 lb. including 490,000 lb.

estimated.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 5,721,982 lb. being 460 thousand lb. less than June 1, 1938 and, compared with last month's revised figures of 7,913,928 lb. showing an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.2 million lb.

VEGETABLES.

Potato holdings, Canadian grown, including those held by commercial growers except in the Province of Quebec, amounted to 34,773 tons, but Ontario reports are not complete.


Onion stocks, Canadian grown were reported as 458 tons, but the reports of Ontario stocks are not complete.


