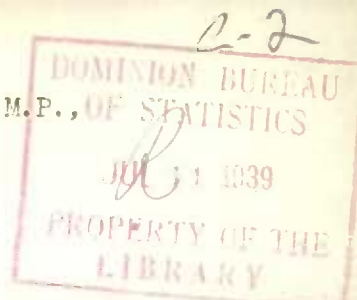

STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JULY 1, 1939.

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage were 4,998 boxes and 5 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 5,003 bushels, compared with 10,543 bushels at July 1, 1938.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT. Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 5,543,516 lb.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 4,982,601 lb.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 10,526,117 lb. but ten firms had not reported at time of going to press. Even without the stocks of these dilatory firms the increase is 1 million lb. over last year and 4.3 million lb. over last month.

VEGETABLES. Potato holdings, Canadian grown, amounted to 2,712 tons, as compared with 3,622 tons a year ago.

Onion stocks, Canadian grown were reported as 89 tons, as compared with 50 tons at the same date last year.
