STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, AUGUST 1, 1939.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage were 5,692 boxes and APPLES. 486 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 6,878 bushels, compared with 7,730 bushels at August 1, 1938, and 5,003 bushels on July 1, 1939. The apparent "Into-Storage" movement was 1,875 bushels.

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT. fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 5,874,036 lb.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 4,857,448 lb.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 10,731,484 lb. but ten firms had not reported at time of going to press.

Potato holdings, Canadian grown, amounted to 1,122 tons, as compared with 1,246 tons a year ago, and 2,971 tons on July 1, 1939. VEGETABLES. Onion stocks, Canadian grown were reported as 367 tons, as compared with 281 tons at the same date last year, and 89 tons on July 1, 1939. Celery stocks, Canadian grown were reported at distributing centres as 1,275 crates while a year ago the stocks were 1,602 crates.
