STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, SEPTEMBER 1, 1939.

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage at distributing centres were 901 barrels, 11,749 boxes and 4,866 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 19,318 bushels, compared with 20,997 bushels at September 1, 1938, and 6,878 bushels on August 1, 1939. The apparent "Into-Storage" movement was 12,440 bushels.

PEARS. Stocks of Canadian pears at distributing centres were reported as 14,219 bushels as compared with 37,033 bushels a year ago.

FROZEN AND SO<sub>2</sub> FRUIT. Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 8,711,802 lb.

Fruit in SO<sub>2</sub> totalled 4,191,238 lb.

Frozen and SO<sub>2</sub> fruit combined were 12,903,040 lb. but several firms had not reported at time of going to press.

VEGETABLES. Potato holdings, Canadian grown, amounted to 963 tons, as compared with 787 tons a year ago, and 1,122 tons on August 1, 1939.

Onion stocks, Canadian grown were reported as 499 tons, as compared with 347 tons at the same date last year, and 367 tons on August 1, 1939.

Celery stocks, Canadian grown were reported at distributing centres as 1,933 crates while a year ago the stocks were 4,707 crates. On August 1, 1939 there were 1,275 crates reported.
