J. K. Finlayson, B.S.A.STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MARCH 1, 1940.

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including storage by Commercial growers, were 426,512 barrels, 795,747 boxes and 282,219 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 2,357,502 bushels, compared with 1,306,221 bushels at March 1, 1939 and 4,263,073 bushels on February 1, 1940. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.9 million bushels as compared with 1.1 million bushels for February, 1939.

PEARS. Stocks of Canadian pears, including storage by Commercial growers were reported as 3,478 bushels, as compared with 5,556 bushels a year ago. In addition there were 5,123 bushels Imported pears. The revised figures for February 1, 1940 were 3,844 bushels, thus showing an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian pears of 366 bushels.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT. Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 4,871,427 lb.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 5,296,397 lb.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 10,167,824 lb. This compares with 9,910,859 lb. last year at the same date, and shows a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.3 million lb. during February, 1940 (but some firms have not yet reported). During February, 1939 there was a similar movement of 1.5 million lb.

VEGETABLES. Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including storage by Commercial growers were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 205,309 tons. In addition, on March 1, 1940 there were reports of 668 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 12,126 tons, as compared with 5,088 tons at the same date last year, and 15,353 tons on February 1, 1940. Not included in these figures are 53 tons of Imported onions.

Celery stocks were reported as 7,070 crates while a year ago the stocks were 3,802 crates. On February 1, 1940 there were 45,574 crates reported. In addition there were 10,848 crates of Imported celery on hand on March 1, 1940.
