STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MAY 1, 1940.

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including storage by commercial growers, were 20,299 barrels, 150,641 boxes and 50,323 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 261,861 bushels, compared with 213,252 bushels at May 1, 1939 and 666,444 bushels on April 1, 1940. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 405 thousand bushels as compared with 341 thousand bushels for April, 1939.

PEARS. Stocks of pears are imported. They amounted to 4,883 bushels.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT. Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 3,953,908 lb.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 3,738,784 lb. In addition 100,000 lb. are estimated for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 7,692,692 lb. not including the estimate. The combined figures were 7,957,078 lb. last year at the same date. Including the estimate, there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.2 million lb. during April, 1940. During April, 1939 there was a similar movement of 1.0 million lb.

VEGETABLES. Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including storage by commercial growers were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 56,539 tons, but stocks of commercial growers were not included for the Province of Quebec. In addition, on May 1, 1940 there were reports showing 1,168 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 3,228 tons, as compared with 1,122 tons at the same date last year, and 9,141 tons on April 1, 1940. Not included in these figures are 225 tons Imported onions.


Celery stocks of Canadian origin are now exhausted. Imported stocks were 8,309 crates.


