STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JULY 1, 1940

APPLES.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage at distributing centres only were 241 barrels, 4,930 boxes and 1,052 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 6,705 bushels, compared with 5,082 bushels at July 1, 1939. Last month there were 61,970 bushels, but these included storage by commercial growers. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 55 thousand bushels as compared with 50 thousand bushels for June, 1939.

PEARS.

Stocks of pears are imported. They amounted to 39 bushels.

FROZEN AND SO<sub>2</sub> FRUIT.

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 4,758,853 lb. including an estimate of 350,000 lb. for firms failing to report.

Fruit in SO<sub>2</sub> totalled 8,278,369 lb. including an estimate of 480,000 lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO<sub>2</sub> fruit combined were 13,037,222 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 11,212,166 lb. Including the estimate, there was a net "Into Storage" movement of 6.6 million lb. during June, 1940. During June, 1939 there was a similar movement of 5.0 million lb.

VEGETABLES.

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, at distributing centres only were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 4,235 tons. In addition, on July 1, 1940 there were reports showing 163 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 108 tons, as compared with 89 tons at the same date last year, and 1,196 tons on June 1, 1940. Not included in this month's figures are 182 tons Imported onions.

Celery stocks are Imported. They amounted to 1,522 crates.
