STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, AUGUST 1, 1940

APPLES.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage at distributing centres only were 87 barrels, 9,290 boxes and 78 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 9,619 bushels compared with 6,799 bushels at August 1, 1939 and 6,705 bushels last month. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 2.9 thousand bushels as compared with 2 thousand bushels for July 1939.

PEARS.

Canadian pears were reported amounting to 2,137 bushels. In addition there were 5,390 bushels of imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT.

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 8,661,846 lb. as compared with 7.9 million lb. last year and 4.7 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 8,223,086 lb. including an estimate of 2,000,000 lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 16,884,932 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 13,804,899 lb. Including the estimate, there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 3.7 million lb. during July, 1940. During July, 1939 there was a similar movement of 2.6 million lb.

VEGETABLES.

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, at distributing centres only were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 1,642 tons. In addition, on August 1, 1940 there were reports showing 54 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 250 tons, as compared with 367 tons at the same date last year, and 108 tons on July 1, 1940. Not included in this month's figures are 9 tons Imported onions.

Celery stocks were reported as 1,276 crates, as compared with 1,275 crates at the same date last year.
