STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT	AND VEGETABLES, JANUARY 1, 1941

APPLES.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 586,336 barrels, 2,584,971 boxes and 594,208 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 4,938,189 bushels compared with 6,018,110 bushels at January 1, 1940 and 6,096,429 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.2 million bushels.

Canadian pears, including those in the hands of commercial growers were PEARS. reported amounting to 12,555 bushels. In addition there were 6,052 bushels of imported on hand,

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT. Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 8,240,520 lb. (including 160,000 lb. estimated for firms failing to report on time) as compared with 6.1 million lb. last year and 8.6 million lb. last month.

Fruit in 302 totalled 8,922,225 lb, including an estimate of 218,000 lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 17,162,775 lb, including the estimate The combined figures last year at the same date were 12,109,845 lb. Including the estimate there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 647 thousand lb. during December 1940. During December 1939 there was an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 925 thousand 1b.

VEGETABLES. Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers were as follows :-

Potato holdings amounted to 223,862 tons. In addition, on January 1, 1941 there were reports showing 398 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 12,887 tons, as compared with 17,847 tons at the same date last year, and 14,600 tons on December 1, 1940.

Celery stocks were reported as 55,732 cratos, as compared with 153,255 crates at the same date last year, In addition 1,823 crates of Imported were reported.




