STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, DECEMBER 1, 1941

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 770,968 barrels, 1,276,348 boxes and 354,766 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 3,944,018 bushels as compared with 6,096,429 bushels at December 1, 1940, and 5,203,951 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.3 million bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common Storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 27,674 bushels. In addition there were 1,431 bushels of imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp.

The total was 7,875,626 lb. (including an estimate of 1.2 million lb. for firms failing to report) as compared with 8.6 million lb. last year and 9.6 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 9,734,011 lb. including an estimate of 2.7 million lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 17,609,637 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 17,809,494 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.1 million lb. during November 1941. During November 1940 there was a similar movement of 640 thousand lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 206,222 tons, a decrease from last menth of 44 thousand tons. There were also 114 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 14,556 tons, as compared with 15,091 tons at the same date last year, and 15,635 tons on November 1, 1941. In addition there were 47 tons of Imported Onions,

Celery. There were 197,452 crates of Canadian Celery and 324 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 1,046,999 lb. Peas; 187,254 lb. String Beans and 1,631,461 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There was an increase over last month of 41 thousand pounds Peas, and decreases of 33 thousand pounds Beans and of 15 thousand pounds Other Vegetables from last month's revised figures.


