STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, FEBRUARY 1, 1941

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 365,064 barrels, 2,159,832 boxes and 505,812 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 3,760,836 bushels compared with 4,263,073 bushels at February 1, 1940 and 4,955,670 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.2 million bushels.

PEARS. Canadian pears, including those in the hands of commercial growers were reported amounting to 10,591 bushels. In addition there were 343 bushels of imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 7,706,308 lb. (including 436,000 lb. estimated for firms failing to report on time) as compared with 5.8 million lb. last year and 8.2 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 8,159,616 lb. including an estimate of 3,750,000 for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 15,865,924 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 11,484,692 lb. Including the estimate there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.4 million lb. during January 1941. During January, 1940 there was a similar movement of 729 thousand lb.

VEGETABLES. Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers, were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 183,757 tons. In addition, on February 1, 1941 there were reports showing 267 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 9,645 tons, as compared with 15,353 tons at the same date last year, and 12,960 tons on January 1, 1941.

Celery stocks were reported as 16,438 crates, as compared with 45,574 crates at the same date last year. In addition 9,987 crates of Imported were reported.
