STOCKS OF CAMADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MARCH 1, 1941

APPLES. Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 164,100 barrels, 1,806,589 boxes and 372,190 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 2,671,039 bushels compared with 2,357,502 bushels at March 1, 1940 and 3,760,836 bushels last month. The apparent "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.1 million bushels.

PEARS. Canadian pears, including those in the hands of commercial growers, were reported amounting to 494 bushels. In addition there were 5,196 bushels of imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 7,078,355 lb. (including 1,150,000 lb. estimated for firms failing to report on time) as compared with 5.0 million lb. last year and 7.7 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 7,464,541 lb. including an estimate of 2,800,000 lb. for firms failing to report.


Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 14,542,896 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 10,488,617 lb. Including the estimate there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 819 thousand lb. during February, 1941. During February, 1940 there was a similar movement of 996 thousand lb.

VEGETABLES. Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers, were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 143,753 tons, a decrease from last month of 40 thousand tons. In addition on March 1, 1941 there were reports showing 366 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 6,473 tons, as compared with 12,126 tons at the same date last year, and 9,688 tons on February 1, 1941.

Celery stocks were reported as 4,554 crates, as compared with 7,070 crates at the same date last year. This was a decrease of almost 12 thousand crates from last month. In addition 8,513 crates of Imported were on hand.




