STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JUNE 1, 1941

APPLES.

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 8,493 barrels, 323,423 boxes and 26,369 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 375,771 bushels compared with 61,970 bushels at June 1, 1940 and 1,025,952 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 650 thousand bushels.

PEARS.

There were 396 bushels of imported pears on hand.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 3,885,801 lb as compared with 3.2 million lb. last year and 5.0 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 3,687,128 lb. including an estimate of 1,270,000 lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 7,572,329 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 6,501,964 lb. Including the estimate there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.2 million lb. during May 1941. During May 1940 there was a similar movement of 1.4 million lb.

VEGETABLES.

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers, were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 43,224 tons, a decrease from last month of 30 thousand tons. In addition on June 1, 1941 there were reports showing 438 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 937 tons, as compared with 1,196 tons at the same date last year, and 2,313 tons on May 1, 1941. In addition there were 289 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 6,911 crates of Imported on hand.
