Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage at distributing centres only were 2,189 barrels, 78,458 boxes and 4,511 bushels in Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 89,536 other containers. bushels compared with 6,705 bushels at July 1, 1940. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 294 thousand bushels.

PEARS

There were 34 bushels of imported pears on hand,

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 8,230,761 lb. including an estimate of 750,000 lb. for firms failing to report as compared with 4.8 million 1b. last year and 3.9 million 1b. last month.

Fruit in 302 totalled 9,062,547 lb. including an estimate of 3,000,000 lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 17,293,308 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 13,352,575 lb. Including the estimate there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 9.8 million 1b. during June 1941. During June 1940 there was a similar movement of 6.9 million 1b.


VEGETABLES Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers, were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 7,432 tons, a decrease from last month of 36 thousand tons. In addition on July 1, 1941 there were reports showing 188 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 442 tons, as compared with 108 tons at the same date last year, and 940 tons on July 1, 1941. In addition there were 91 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 754 crates of Canadian Celery and 2,175 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES This is the first report of frozen vegetables in Canada. There were 691,446 lb. Peas; 48,824 lb. String Beans, and 392,220 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.


