STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, AUG. 1, 1941

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage at distributing centres only were 374 barrels, 17,935 boxes and 1,940 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 20,997 bushels compared with 9,619 bushels at Aug. 1, 1940, and 89,536 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 68 thousand bushels.

PEARS

There were 3,883 bushels of imported pears on hand.

FROZEN AND SO<sub>2</sub> FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 10,442,333 lb. including an estimate of 2 million lb. for firms failing to report, as compared with 8.8 million lb. last year and 7.9 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO<sub>2</sub> totalled 12,013,491 lb. including an estimate of 3 million lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO<sub>2</sub> fruit combined were 22,455,824 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 16,972,675 lb. Including the estimate there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 5.9 million lb. during July 1941. During July 1940 there was a similar movement of 3.6 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, at distributing centres only were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 3,312 tons, a decrease from last month of 4 thousand tons. In addition on Aug. 1, 1941 there were reports showing 6 tons Imported potatoes.

Onion stocks were reported as 462 tons, as compared with 250 tons at the same date last year, and 442 tons on July 1, 1941. In addition there were 36 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 2,024 crates of Canadian Celery and 533 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 1,114,033 lb. Peas; 36,721 lb. String Beans and 557,569 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers. The revised figures of last month show an increase this month of 400 thousand pounds peas, a decrease of 12 thousand pounds string beans and an increase of 165 thousand pounds Other Vegetables.
