STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, SEPT. 1, 1941

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage at distributing centres only were 1,755 barrels, 13,639 boxes and 4,975 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 23,879 bushels compared with 76,705 bushels at September 1, 1940, and 20,997 bushels last month. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 3 thousand bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common Storage amounted to 71,904 bushels. In addition there were 9,518 bushels of imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 10,441,113 lb. including an estimate of 2.5 million lb. for firms failing to report, as compared with 10.9 million lb. last year and 9.7 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 10,024,996 lb. including an estimate of 2.1 million lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 20,526,109 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 19,593,932 lb. Including the estimate there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.4 million lb. during August 1941. During August 1940 there was an "Into-Storage" movement of 2.6 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, at distributing centres only were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 2,997 tons, a decrease from last month of 815 tons.

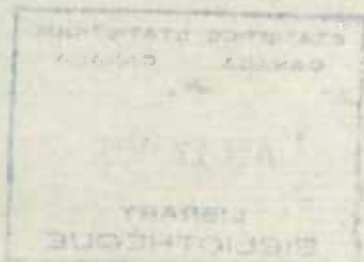
Onion stocks were reported as 705 tons, as compared with 624 tons at the same date last year, and 462 tons on August 1, 1941. In addition there were 16 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 1,763 crates of Canadian Celery and 192 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 990,809 lb. Peas; 169,181 lb. String Beans and 456,376 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

These figures show a decrease this month of 123 thousand pounds peas, an increase of 132 thousand pounds string beans and a decrease of 100 thousand pounds Other Vegetables. from the revised figures of last month.
