STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, OCTOBER 1, 1942

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, at distributing centres only, were 64,436 barrels, 175,999 boxes and 224,753 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 594,060 bushels as compared with 594,775 bushels at October 1, 1941, and 24,474 bushels last month. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 570 thousand bushels.

PEARS

There were 69,557 bushels of Canadian Pears, and 1,639 bushels of Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 11,634,828 lb. as compared with 11.6 million lb. last year and 13.1 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 15,770,206 lb. including an estimate of 1.5 million lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 27,405,034 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 22,047,608 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.3 million lb. during September 1942. During September 1941 there was a similar movement of 742 thousand lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, at distributing centres only, were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 3,718 tons, there being an "Into-Storage" movement of only 1.6 thousand tons, as compared with a similar movement of 29.5 thousand tons last year.

Onion stocks were reported as 2,840 tons, as compared with 7,754 tons at the same date last year, and 903 tons on September 1, 1942. In addition there were 73 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 109,432 crates of Canadian Celery and 70 crates of Imported in stock.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

Frozen Vegetables totalled 2,764,232 lb. being Peas 1,796,300 lb., String Beans 131,112 lb. and Other Vegetables 836,820 lb. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There was an increase over last month of 210 thousand lb. The total on the corresponding date last year was 1,693,455 lb.
