STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, NOVEMBER 1, 1942

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 1,210,793 barrels, 3,200,557 boxes and 836,586 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 7,669,522 bushels as compared with 5,203,951 bushels at November 1, 1941, and 594,060 bushels last month. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 7.1 million bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 73,527 bushels. In addition there were 7,941 bushels Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 10,143,461 lb. (including an estimate of 800,000 lb.) as compared with 9.7 million lb. last year and 11.7 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 15,345,386 lb. including an estimate of 6.2 million lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 25,488,847 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 19,154,192 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.9 million lb. during October 1942. During October 1941 there was a similar movement of 2.9 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers, were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 285,438 tons, there being an "Into-Storage" movement of 282 thousand tons, as compared with a similar movement of 219 thousand tons last year.

Onion stocks were reported as 18,293 tons, as compared with 16,085 tons at the same date last year, and 2,840 tons on October 1, 1942. In addition there were 61 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 275,963 crates of Celery on hand.

Other. Beginning this month four other vegetables will be reported. Beets 1,586 tons; Cabbage 8,897 tons; Carrots 9,903 tons; Parsnips 1,091 tons.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

Frozen Vegetables totalled 1,959,455 lb. being Peas 1,274,727 lb. String Beans 118,006 lb. and Other Vegetables 376,722 lb. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers. An estimate of 190,000 lb. is included in the total for firms failing to report on time.

There was a decrease from last month of 812 thousand lb. The total on the corresponding date last year was 2,872,468 lb.
