

STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, DECEMBER 1, 1942

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 988,999 barrels, 2,646,483 boxes and 639,310 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 6,252,790 bushels as compared with 3,944,018 bushels at December 1, 1941, and 7,669,478 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.4 million bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 17,150 bushels. In addition there were 11,204 bushels Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 9,055,214 lb. (including an estimate of 200 thousand lb.) as compared with 7.9 million lb. last year and 10.2 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 14,182,743 lb. including an estimate of 1 million lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 23,237,957 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 17,688,311 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.3 million lb. during November 1942. During November 1941 there was a similar movement of 1.5 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 253,354 tons, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 32.1 thousand tons, as compared with a similar movement of 44.1 thousand tons last year.

Onion stocks were reported as 18,368 tons, as compared with 14,556 tons at the same date last year, and 18,292 tons on November 1, 1942. In addition there were 59 tons of Imported Onions.


Celery. There were 175,216 crates of Canadian Celery and 290 crates of Imported on hand.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 1,585 tons; Cabbage 9,164 tons; Carrots 9,308 tons; Parsnips 1,288 tons.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

Frozen Vegetables totalled 2,363,712 lb. being Peas 1,250,600 lb. String Beans 120,214 lb. and Other Vegetables 992,898 lb. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There was an increase over last month of 408 thousand lb. The total on the corresponding date last year was 2,876,062 lb.
