## STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, DECEMBER 1, 1942

APPLES
Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 988,799 barrels, $2,646,483$ boxes and 639,310 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 6,252,790 bushels as compared with 3,9ís,018 bushels at December 1 , 1941, and 7,669,478 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1. A million bushels.

## PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common storage, including those in the
hands of commercial growers, amounted to 17,150 bushels. In
addition there were 11,204 bushels Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT
Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one pare sugar, and as pulp. The total was 9,055,21x lb. (inoluding an ostimate of 200 thousand 1 b .) as compared with 7.9 million lb . last year and 10.2 million lb . last month.

Fruit in $\mathrm{SO}_{2}$ totalled $14,182,743 \mathrm{Ib}$. including an estimate of 1 million $1 b_{\text {. for firms failing to report on time. }}$

Frozen and $\mathrm{SO}_{2}$ fruit combined were $23,237,957 \mathrm{lb}$. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same dete were 17,688,311 1b. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.3 million lb. during November 1942. During November 1941 there was a similar movement of 1.5 million $1 b$.

## VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables were as follows:
Potato holdings amounted to 253,354 tons, there being an "Out-ofStorage" movement of 32.1 thousand tons, as compared with a sirilar movement of $\& 4.1$ thousand tons last year.

Onion stooks were roported 及s 18,368 tons, as compared with 14,556 tons at the same date last year, and 18,292 tons on November 1, 1942. In addition there were 59 tons of Imported Onions.

Colery. There were 175,216 orates of Canadian Celery and 290 crates of Imported on hand.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 1,585 tons; Cabbage 9,164 tons; Carrots 9,308 tons; Parsnips 1,288 tons.

## FROZEN VEGETABLES

Frozen Vegetables totalled 2,363,712 1b. being Peas 1,250,600 1b. String Beans $120,2141 \mathrm{~b}$. and Other Vegetables $992,898 \mathrm{lb}$. No separation is made of tetail and wholesale containers.

There was an inorease over Isst month of 408 thousand 2 b . The total on the corresponding date last year wns 2,876,062 1b.
