STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, FEBRUARY 1, 1942

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 138,979 barrels, 566,753 boxes and 122,270 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 1,105,960 bushels as compared with 3,760,836 bushels at February 1, 1941, and 2,330,297 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.2 million bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common Storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 5,737 bushels. In addition there were 2,508 bushels of imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 5,066,532 lb. (including an estimate of 500 thousand lb. for firms failing to report) as compared with 7.7 million lb. last year and 6.9 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 9,475,032 lb. including an estimate of 2.7 million lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 14,541,564 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 15,715,382 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 732 thousand lb. during January 1942. During January 1941 there was an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.5 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 122,381 tons, a decrease from last month of 35 thousand tons. There were also 106 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 7,785 tons, as compared with 9,688 tons at the same date last year, and 11,756 tons on January 1, 1942. In addition there were 59 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 21,077 crates of Canadian Celery and 7,229 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 657,846 lb. Peas; 185,327 lb. String Beans and 522,194 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There were decreases from last month's revised figures of 172 thousand pounds Peas; 3 thousand pounds Beans, and of 103 thousand pounds Other Vegetables.




