STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MARCH 1, 1942

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 43,502 barrels, 380,669 boxes and 63,948 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 575,123 bushels as compared with 2,671,039 bushels at March 1, 1941, and 1,106,560 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 531 thousand bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common Storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 2,178 bushels. In addition there were 3,349 bushels of Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 4,455,257 lb. (including an estimate of 250 thousand lb. for firms failing to report) as compared with 7.0 million lb. last year and 5.4 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 9,006,136 lb. including an estimate of 1.7 million lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 13,461,393 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 14,801,351 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.3 million lb. during February 1942. During February 1941 there was an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 914 thousand lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 53,462 tons, a decrease from last month of 69 thousand tons. There were also 47 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 5,357 tons, as compared with 6,473 tons at the same date last year, and 7,785 tons on February 1, 1942. In addition there were 9 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 4,410 crates of Canadian Celery and 8,237 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 598,910 lb. Peas; 71,693 lb. String Beans and 523,012 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There were decreases from last month's revised figures of 59 thousand pounds Peas and 114 thousand pounds Beans.
