STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, APRIL 1, 1942APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 11,396 barrels, 167,370 boxes and 28,651 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 230,209 bushels as compared with 1,774,004 bushels at April 1, 1941, and 575,123 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 345 thousand bushels. In addition there were stocks of Imported apples amounting to 24,028 bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common Storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 1,060 bushels. In addition there were 3,866 bushels of Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO<sub>2</sub> FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 4,477,525 lb. (including an estimate of 350 thousand lb. for firms failing to report) as compared with 6.0 million lb. last year and 4.5 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO<sub>2</sub> totalled 7,631,391 lb. including an estimate of 400 thousand lb. for firms failing to report.

Frozen and SO<sub>2</sub> fruit combined were 12,108,916 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 13,070,915 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.6 million lb. during March 1942. During March 1941 there was a similar movement of 1.7 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers, were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 60,171 tons, a decrease from last month of 32 thousand tons as compared with a decrease of 35.5 thousand tons last year. There were also 153 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 2,815 tons, as compared with 4,657 tons at the same date last year, and 5,349 tons on March 1, 1942. In addition there were 8 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 163 crates of Canadian Celery and 16,351 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 567,369 lb. Peas; 142,408 lb. String Beans and 444,957 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There were decreases from last month's revised figures of 33 thousand pounds Peas and 78 thousand pounds Other Vegetables, while there was an increase over last month of 70 thousand lb. String Beans.
