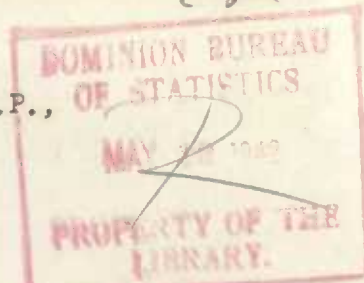

STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MAY 1, 1942

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 3,807 barrels, 75,140 boxes and 10,198 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 96,759 bushels as compared with 1,025,952 bushels at May 1, 1941, and 230,533 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 134 thousand bushels. In addition there were stocks of Imported apples amounting to 44,720 bushels.

PEARS

Stocks of Canadian pears are now exhausted, but there were 1,014 bushels of Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 3,458,108 lb. (including an estimate of 110 thousand lb. for firms failing to report) as compared with 4.9 million lb. last year and 4.5 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 6,564,698 lb. including an estimate of 3 million lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 10,022,806 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 9,802,421 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.4 million lb. during April 1942. During April 1941 there was a similar movement of 3.3 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including those held by commercial growers, were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 44,568 tons, a decrease from last month of 15.6 thousand tons as compared with a decrease of 34.9 thousand tons last year. There were also 146 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 881 tons, as compared with 2,813 tons at the same date last year, and 2,948 tons on April 1, 1942. In addition there were 16 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. Canadian stocks are now exhausted. There were, however, 13,094 crates of Imported on hand.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 428,801 lb. Peas; 118,037 lb. String Beans and 518,354 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There were decreases from last month's revised figures of 138 thousand pounds Peas and 24 thousand pounds String Beans, while there was an increase over last month of 73 thousand lb. Other Vegetables.
