STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JULY 1, 1942

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, at distributing centres only, were 47 barrels, 6,001 boxes and 912 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 7,054 bushels as compared with 89,536 bushels at July 1, 1941, and 29,120 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 22.1 thousand bushels. In addition there were stocks of Imported apples amounting to 5,417 bushels. STATISTICS STATISTIQUE

PEARS

There were no pears in stock.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT

BIBLIOTHÈQUE Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 6,370,860 lb. as compared with 7.4 million lb. last year and 2.8 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 5,087,245 lb. including an estimate of 600 thousand lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 11,458,105 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 16,083,174 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 3.1 million lb. during June 1942. During June 1941 there was a similar movement of 8.6 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables at distributing centres only, were as follows:-

Potato holdings amounted to 3,793 tons, a decrease from last month of 7.2 thousand tons, as compared with a decrease of 36.2 thousand tons last year. There were also 387 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 117 tons, as compared with 442 tons at the same date last year, and 202 tons on June 1, 1942. In addition there were 864 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 1,303 crates of Canadian Celery and 1,914 crates of Imported in stock.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

There were 442,990 lb. Peas; 80,840 lb. String Beans and 426,206 lb. Other Vegetables on hand. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There were decreases from last month's revised figures of 14 thousand 1b. String Beans, and 7 thousand pounds Other Vegetables, while there was an increase over last month of 76 thousand 1b. Peas.


