PROPERTY OF THE

STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JANUARY 1, 1943APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 698,758 barrels, 2,085,527 boxes and 491,938 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 4,673,739 bushels as compared with 2,330,297 bushels at January 1, 1942, and 6,252,790 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.6 million bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 8,655 bushels. In addition there were 12,070 bushels Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO<sub>2</sub> FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 7,362,658 lb. (including an estimate of 500 thousand lb.) as compared with 6.9 million lb. last year and 9.0 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO<sub>2</sub> totalled 13,387,992 lb. including an estimate of 4 million lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO<sub>2</sub> fruit combined were 20,750,650 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 15,619,544 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.6 million lb. during December 1942. During December 1941 there was a similar movement of 2.1 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 211,427 tons, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 41.9 thousand tons, as compared with a similar movement of 48.7 thousand tons last year. There were also 18 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 15,612 tons, as compared with 11,756 tons at the same date last year, and 18,368 tons on December 1, 1942. In addition there were 53 tons of Imported Onions.

Celery. There were 52,609 crates of Canadian Celery and 2,250 crates of Imported on hand.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 1,232 tons; Cabbage 7,372 tons; Carrots 7,769 tons; Parsnips 1,083 tons.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

Frozen Vegetables totalled 1,559,562 lb. being Peas 888,887 lb., String Beans 104,933 lb. and Other Vegetables 565,742 lb. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers.

There was a decrease from last month of 804 thousand lb. The total on the corresponding date last year was 1,644,988 lb.
