STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, NOVEMBER 1, 1943

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage including holdings APPLES in the hands of commercial growers except in Nova Scotia and British Columbia were 236,184 barrels, 205,927 boxes and 877,236 bushels in all other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 1,791,715 bushels but as the holdings by commercial growers in the Annapolis and Okanagan Valleys are not included, these figures are not comparable with those of last year.

PEARS

There were 9,099 bushels Canadian pears in storage.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 12,406,960 lb. (including an estimate of 500 thousand lb.), as compared with 10,2 million 1b. last year and 14.1 million 1b. last month.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 17,182,693 lb. including an estimate of 1.0 million lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO2 fruit combined were 29,589,653 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 25,583,082 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 44 thousand 1b. during October 1943. During October 1942 there was an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.8 million 1b.

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables including holdings in the VEGETABLES hands of commercial growers except in Nova Scotia and British Columbia were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 42,887 tons. There were also 30 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 7,913 tons.

Celery. There were 245,068 crates of Canadian Celery on hand and 100 crates of imported stocks.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 962 tons; Cabbage 4,425 tons; Carrots 5,147 tons; Parsnips 661 tons. In addition to these Canadian stocks there were Imported holdings of 5 tons Carrots.

Frozen Vegetables totalled 3,523,546 lb. being Peas 2,026,237 lb., FROZEN VEGETABLES String Beans 230,890 lb. and Other Vegetables 1,266,419 lb. The total on the corresponding date last year was 2,730,548 lb. There was an increase over last month of 604 thousand 1b.
