STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MARCH 1, 1943APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 206,007 barrels, 906,266 boxes and 252,574 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 1,776,861 bushels as compared with 575,123 bushels at March 1, 1942 and 3,302,728 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.5 million bushels.

PEARS

Canadian pears, in Cold and Common storage, including those in the hands of commercial growers, amounted to 1,614 bushels. In addition there were 6,480 bushels Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO₂ FRUIT

Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar, and as pulp. The total was 6,203,943 lb. (including an estimate of 250,000 lb.) as compared with 4.5 million lb. last year and 6.6 million lb. last month.

Fruit in SO₂ totalled 11,209,194 lb. including an estimate of 4 million lb. for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SO₂ fruit combined were 17,413,137 lb. including the estimate. The combined figures last year at the same date were 13,739,528 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.8 million lb. during February 1943. During February 1942 there was a similar movement of 1.0 million lb.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 134,805 tons there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 36.9 thousand tons, as compared with a similar movement of 30.4 thousand tons last year. There were also 130 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onions stocks were reported as 9,604 tons, as compared with 5,353 tons at the same date last year, and 12,059 tons on February 1, 1943. In addition there were 9 tons of Imported stock.

Celery. There were 1,738 crates of Canadian Celery and 11,116 crates of Imported on hand.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 488 tons; Cabbage 2,614 tons; Carrots 4,359 tons; Parsnips 436 tons. In addition to these Canadian stocks there were Imported holdings of 4 tons Beets, 122 tons Cabbages, and 104 tons carrots.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

Frozen Vegetables totalled 1,024,590 lb. being Peas 637,614 lb., String Beans 75,145 lb. and Other Vegetables 311,831 lb. No separation is made of retail and whole sale containers.

The total on the corresponding date last year was 1,195,272 lb. There was a decrease from last month of 162,870 lb.
